Featured Guest Speaker PID Dr. Patti Hill



Featured Guest Speaker

Psychologist and educator, Dr. Patti Hill earned her Ph.D. from the University of Alberta. She is a teacher, a certified teacher of the deaf and hard of hearing, and a registered psychologist. Dr. Hill mentors students from the University of Alberta, City University and Yorkville University. Dedicated to serving her profession, Dr. Hill has also served as President of the Alberta School Psychologist Association. Dr. Hill is the co-owner and Director of Professional Services at ecsi ltd., working with schools, families and government agencies to

design and support programs and interventions for special needs children and students.

In her community work, Dr. Hill was the founding chair of the Lions Villages of Greater Edmonton Society. Dr. Hill served as first female Chair of the Lions Eye Research Institute of Northern Alberta (2002/03), and first woman president of the Edmonton (Host) Lions Club. In 2007, she became the first Canadian woman to be elected Director on the Lions Clubs International Board of Directors.

Lions are volunteer members of the world's largest and most active service club organization. Edmonton (Host) Lions Club is proud to have been an active Lions Club since 1929. Some of the projects our club has been able to assist over the years are:

- Funding for the Creche Society - Edmonton's first day care for single working mothers (1930s)
- Built Sunset Cottage - first senior's low rental housing (1930s) and Kensington Court (1940s)
- Members started building of the first Lions Dream home for Klondike Days (1950s)
- Collected 100,000 pairs of glasses for distribution in India (1950s)
- Provided funds to purchase Alberta's first dialysis machine (1970s) for the University Hospital in Edmonton
- Contributed \$100,000.00 towards the start of the Lions of Alberta Eye Bank (1980s)
- Contributed \$88,600 to start the Dr. Kostiuik bionic Ear Project. This cochlear implant program allowed many to hear for the very first time.
- \$20,000 towards a handi-bus for Norwood Extended Care Facility (1990s)
- 2000s recipients include: Inner City Hot Lunch Program, Telus World of Science, Habitat for Humanity, ABC Headstart, Little Bits Therapeutic Riding Association and Camp Health, Hope and Happiness
- Provided funding to equip the first pediatric operating room at the Stollery Children's Hospital
- Provided funding to upgrade and remodel The Grey Nun's Hospital (Edmonton General) Alzheimer Care Facility 10Y
